The IntelliKeys is used with more than the IntelliTools Classroom Suite—it can provide access to any educational software program, including Microsoft Office and other popular tools. During this hands-on lab session, participants will use standard and customize overlays to access core educational software and create switch-accessible curricular activities and talking books. We will also use the IntelliKeys to access other popular assistive technologies including Kurzweil 3000, Solo, WYNN and Inspiration. Participants are encouraged to bring examples of their own creations to share and to bring software programs that they want to make accessible through the IntelliKeys.

About the Presenter

Kelly Fonner, MS is a self-employed consultant and trainer in the areas of assistive and educational technology. She has been working with individuals with disabilities since the mid 1970s and with assistive technology since 1983. Her work experiences have been as a teacher assistant, teacher, instructional media specialist and assistive technology consultant in early childhood, preschool and school-age programs. She has consulted to university and adult programs concerning access to technology by persons with disabilities. Kelly speaks internationally on a wide range of topics including technology integration, AAC, computer access, literacy, library access, and assistive technology assessment and implementation strategies. She has taught at the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and for California State University-Northridge in the Assistive Technology Applications Certificate Program and Symposium Series. Kelly has a B.S. in special education, an M.S. in educational technology, and holds an ATACP certificate of learning from CSUN.
